

# Arthur MILLER'S THE PRICE



One of the most personal plays by one of the greatest American playwrights of the 20th century, Arthur Miller's **THE PRICE** is a captivating story about the struggle to make peace with the past and create hope for the future.

The story centers on a man who gave up his dream of an education to support his father

after the Great Depression wiped out their family fortune. Decades later, he returns to his childhood home to sell the remainder of his parents' estate. His wife, his estranged brother and the scheming furniture dealer hired to appraise their belongings all arrive with their own agendas, forcing him to confront a bottled-up question about the value of his sacrifice.

Emmy winner **Danny DeVito** makes his Broadway debut as the furniture dealer, along with Tony and Academy Award nominee **Mark Ruffalo** as the returning son, Tony nominee **Jessica Hecht** as his wife and Emmy winner **Tony Shalhoub** as his brother. Terry Kinney, Steppenwolf Theatre Company co-founder, directs this drama by Arthur Miller, whose best known plays include *A View from the Bridge*, *The Crucible*, *All My Sons* and the Pulitzer Prize-winning *Death of a Salesman*.
