



HARPER LEE'S TO KILL A MOCKINGBIRD

Winner of the 1961 Pulitzer Prize in Fiction, Harper Lee's masterpiece stars Tony, Oscar and Emmy nominated Ed Harris as attorney Atticus Finch.

Published in 1960, the novel was an astounding success, as was the 1962 film. Now, Emmy and Academy Award winner Aaron Sorkin ("The West Wing," "The Social Network") has adapted it for Broadway, and Tony winner Bartlett Sher (*My Fair Lady*, *South Pacific*, *The King and I*, *The Light in the Piazza*) directs.

TO KILL A MOCKINGBIRD is inspired by Harper Lee's own childhood in Alabama and deals with racial tensions in a small southern town. The character of Atticus Finch, based on Lee's father, is one of literature's symbols of honesty and righteousness. The character of Scout, based on Lee herself, has come to define youthful innocence—and its unavoidable loss.
